<p>If you are accepted into a University of Divinity course, the university will send you an Acceptance Contract, which you must complete, sign, and return to the Overseas Students Officer. The university will then send you a Confirmation of Enrolment (COE).</p>	<p>If you are accepted into a University of Divinity Course you will receive a letter of acceptance and be able to commence your studies at the beginning of first or second semester.</p>

A 'certified copy' is a copy of an original document such as a birth certificate, marriage certificate or proof of identity that has been authorised (or stamped) as being a true copy of an original.

<p>You must use your Confirmation of Enrolment (COE) to apply to an Australian diplomatic post for a student visa. Please contact the Department of Immigration and Border Protection for more information on the process of obtaining a student visa.</p>	
<p>Once you have been granted your Visa please bring a certified copy to the Academic Dean or Postgraduate Coordinator.</p>	
<p>Orientation for students on Overseas student visas is obligatory and takes place at the end of the first week of each semester. There is a general orientation session at the beginning of each academic year.</p>	<p>Students are invited to Orientation for both domestic and international students. While this is not obligatory, it is important to be part of this process of welcome into your College of study.</p>
<p>For Your Information:</p> <p>New students commencing their course of study from Semester 1 need to be present in Melbourne by early February or July for Semester 2. If you do not arrive in time to attend your first classes you run the risk of being reported to the Department of Immigration and Border Protection for unsatisfactory course progress.</p> <p>The Australian Government requires all tertiary institutions to ensure that international students have their study and results monitored constantly during their study in Australia. You are required to complete your course in the time frame indicated on your COE.</p> <p>If you have a student visa, you must study full time, and are permitted to work part time (20 hours). Overseas Students are expected to attend at least 80% of classes Failure to comply with these requirements may result in your visa being cancelled. If this happens you will be required to leave Australia.</p>
