The majority of our international students are sponsored by Religious Orders which have been part of YTU's history over forty years. These currently include the Divine Word Missionaries, Redemptorists, Missionaries of the Sacred Heart, Passionist Fathers and Carmelite Friars. There are some lay international students, diocesan clergy and a variety of religious sisters for example: the Sisters of the Holy Spirit, Sisters of Our Lady of the Missions, Congregation of the Sisters of the Nativity, and the Lovers of the Holy Cross Sisters.
